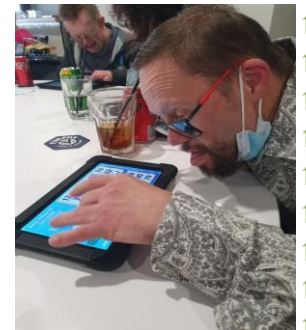

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UPDATES:



The National Disability Insurance Agency (the Agency) has released its 2022-26 Corporate Plan. The Corporate Plan contains the strategic roadmap to achieve their purpose, providing guidance to work for the next four years. Focus is on the NDIA's five aspirations:

1. A quality experience and improved outcomes for participants
2. A competitive market with innovative supports
3. A genuinely connected and engaged stakeholder sector
4. A high-performing NDIA
5. A financially sustainable NDIS.

The NDIA Corporate Plan 2022-26 outlines the commitment to continuing to:

- Focus on essential service delivery and support for participants through the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, delivering new and enhanced capability that ensures participants are able to access the supports they need from service providers.
- Work with participants and other stakeholders to enable the growth of a market of adequate size, quality and innovation.
- Improve the NDIS provider experience, in part by improving the efficiency of interactions with the Agency, participants, providers and other stakeholders through the continued enhancement of our digital ecosystem. This enables our digital partners to connect their systems directly with ours and increasingly automate business processes.

Data highlights

- 534,655 participants are now receiving NDIS support with 19,291 new participants joining this quarter (a 3% increase).
- Total payments for participant supports was \$28.7 billion (on an accrual basis) from 1 July 2021 – 30 June 2022.
- The largest support categories are:
 - core daily activities (55% of total payments).
 - social and community participation (19% of total payments), and capacity-building daily activities (therapy services, 13% of total payments).
